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**Purpose.** The 5-Year and Annual PHA Plans provide a ready source for interested parties to locate basic PHA policies, rules, and requirements concerning the PHA's operations, programs, and services. They also inform HUD, families served by the PHA, and members of the public of the PHA's mission, goals, and objectives for serving the needs of low-, very low-, and extremely low-income families.

**Applicability.** The Form HUD-50075-HP is to be completed annually by **High Performing PHAs**. PHAs that meet the definition of a Standard PHA, Troubled PHA, HCV-Only PHA, Small PHA, or Qualified PHA do not need to submit this form. PHAs with zero public housing units must continue to comply with the PHA Plan requirements until they closeout their Section 9 programs (ACC termination).

**Definitions.**

- (1) **High-Performer PHA** - A PHA that owns or manages more than 550 combined public housing units and housing choice vouchers (HCVs) and was designated as a high performer on both the most recent Public Housing Assessment System (PHAS) and Section Eight Management Assessment Program (SEMAP) assessments if administering both programs, SEMAP for PHAs that only administer tenant-based assistance and/or project-based assistance, or PHAS if only administering public housing.
- (2) **Small PHA** - A PHA that is not designated as PHAS or SEMAP troubled, and that owns or manages less than 250 public housing units and any number of vouchers where the total combined units exceed 550.
- (3) **Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Only PHA** - A PHA that administers more than 550 HCVs, was not designated as troubled in its most recent SEMAP assessment and does not own or manage public housing.
- (4) **Standard PHA** - A PHA that owns or manages 250 or more public housing units and any number of vouchers where the total combined units exceed 550, and that was designated as a standard performer in the most recent PHAS or SEMAP assessments.
- (5) **Troubled PHA** - A PHA that achieves an overall PHAS or SEMAP score of less than 60 percent.
- (6) **Qualified PHA** - A PHA with 550 or fewer public housing dwelling units and/or HCVs combined and is not PHAS or SEMAP troubled.

**Project Based Vouchers.**

HAH engaged in 2023 to develop a Project Based Voucher 80 unit complex known as Goodaker Village. This is part of our deconcentrate plan. Goodaker Village is nearing finished construction of all buildings and in the process of housing tenants in the completed units. It is located at 100 Old Lovers Lane, Hopkinsville, KY.

**B.3 Progress Report.**

Provide a description of the PHA's progress in meeting its Mission and Goals described in the PHA 5-Year Plan.

**In the fall of 2025, HUD projected HAH to be in shortfall by December 2025. Due to shortfall projection, HAH took steps official steps to reduce HCV program costs including not offering HCV vouchers and stopping portability absorption. HAH has continued its efforts to maintain its high performer status for the Section 8 program. HAH continues to focus on implementation of the HOTMA federal guidelines. HAH manages several complexes in the Hopkinsville area to diversify funding sources and maximize the use of funds to improve the lives of residents. HAH has initiated an intensive software conversion to begin working towards a goal of paperless processes to increase efficiency. HAH has continued its efforts to install security cameras throughout the developments to provide additional security for its residents. HAH has continued its efforts to construct housing for low-income individuals which includes the development of an 80 unit complex for seniors that will**

	be housed in 2026.

On the form, there is not sufficient documentation of failed items and the passing inspection forms have the date of the initial failed inspection but not the actual passing date. Other control issues identified include lack of follow-up on failed units and abatement of HAP after allowable period. Recommendations were to implement more stringent procedures for monitoring HQS compliance, including timely reinspection and enforcement of HAP abatement or voucher cancellation. Enhance training for staff involved in the HQS process to ensure a thorough understanding of compliance requirements. Establish a system of regular audits to identify and rectify lapses in HQS enforcement promptly. In response to this issue, a comprehensive Corrective Action Plan was submitted which is attached.</b></p>
