Payments and Account Balances

Please keep in mind, <u>rent must be paid by the 10th</u> of every month. If we haven't received the rent payment by the 10th of each month. Starting in January 2021, we are charging late fees again. If your rent is not paid on the 11th of every month, a late fee of \$30.00 will be applied to your account and you will receive a 30-Day Eviction Notice and all balances will need to be paid in full by the 30th day. If rent <u>is</u> paid by the 10th, you have until the end of the month to pay the electric/gas/work order charges. When you are making payments to the Housing Authority, please write your name and address clearly on the money order or check. If we cannot clearly read your name, then we are unable to post it to your account.

Herbie Curbies and Grounds

We are continuing to ask everyone to participate in our ongoing effort to clean up the grounds. Please pick up any trash when you see it to prevent a **\$15.00 clean up charge**. **Nothing should ever be in the grass** or any part of the yard even if there isn't grass growing. - Any items on top of the refrigerator or stove will need to be cleared. The stove and refrigerator will be pulled out by the technicians to treat behind the appliances.
- The countertop and stovetop will need to be clear of food and dirty dishes
- Have your apartment clutter free for the technicians to be able to fully treat your unit.

Valentine's Day Mix and Match Mini Cheesecakes



Crust

1 pkg. graham crackers 2 tsp. granulated sugar 4 tbsp. butter

Filling

2 pkgs. Cream cheese 1 c. granulated sugar 2 tsp. vanilla extract 1 tsp. salt 3 large eggs ½ c. heavy cream

Directions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. Line 48 muffin pan cups with liners.
- 2. Prepare crust: Pulse the graham crackers and sugar in a food processor until finely ground. Add the butter and pulse until the mixture resembles wet sand. Press about 1 heaping teaspoon of the crumb mixture into the bottom of each liner. Bake for 5 minutes, or until lightly golden, then cool completely on wire racks. Reduce the oven temperature to 325 degrees.
- 3. **Prepare filling:** In a large bowl, with a mixer on medium speed, beat the cream cheese and sugar for 3 minutes, or until fluffy. Beat in the vanilla and salt until combined. Add the eggs, 1 at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in the heavy cream, then divide the filling among the prepared liners.
- 4. Bake the cheesecakes for 12 to 15 minutes, or until set, but still slightly jiggly and moist in the center. Let them cool in the pans for 5 minutes, then transfer them to wire racks to cool completely. Garnish with your choice of toppings (see below).

Topping Ideas: Lemon Poppy Seed: lemon curd and poppy seeds; Turkish Delight: apricot jam and finely chopped pistachios; Horchata: whipped cream and ground cinnamon; Farm Stand: blueberries and fresh basil; Cookies 'n Cream: crushed Oreo cookies
